SHOW RULES, PROCEDURES AND REGULATIONS

This show is licensed by the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy and is open to all.

Exhibitors must ensure that they have a current copy (November 2008) of the GCCF Rules. Section 4 gives you the information you need to know, as an exhibitor, about eligibility, presentation, countersignatures etc.

Please make sure that you read and understand the Rules and this schedule before entering the show. Ignorance of the Rules will not be accepted as an excuse for their breach. Many have NOT been repeated in full in this schedule.

ELIGIBILITY

Balinese Adults, Kittens and Neuters are eligible for this Show if registered with the GCCF. All registered Pedigree cats and Non-Pedigree cats are eligible for exhibition.

All registrations and/or transfers must have reached the GCCF Office by 7th May 2010 or the exhibit will be DISQUALIFIED. If you have entered the exhibit in your name and it is transferred away from you before this date it will also be DISQUALIFIED because the entry form becomes invalid. If you have not yet got the registration number when you enter, write RAF (registration applied for) instead, fill in the name you have applied for, and send/email the number and any change of name to the Show Manager when they arrive.

If you change the registered COLOUR of your exhibit before show day, please inform the Show Manager as soon as possible. There is no "three week limit" on this.

Unregistered cats from unregistered or unknown parents, of traditional "moggie" appearance, may enter Non-Pedigree classes in the Household Pet Section. Cats of known full or half pedigree background, registered or unregistered, or cats of pedigree appearance but of unknown background may enter Non-Pedigree classes in the Household Pet Section. All Household Pets over six months of age must be neutered. Household Pet exhibits may also enter the Tonkinese Cat Club Show, maximum 4 classes per show.

SHOW ENTRY FORM

Please read the entry form and the GCCF Rules relating to entry thoroughly before completing the form. If you are entering a cat in single ownership and one in joint ownership, please use separate forms. If you are entering a cat in class E1 the show entry form must be completed exactly as for competition entries, marking E1 in the Open Class box.

Exhibits entered incorrectly will be disqualified from the class concerned or from the show, depending on the error. Entry fees will not be refunded.

Please check your entry very carefully to make sure that it is clear and legible, that you have entered your cat in the correct classes, that you have signed the form and that you have sent the correct money. Any entries which are incorrect will be returned and the resulting delay could mean that you are too late to enter. We will NOT allow you to sign the form or pay the balance of the money on Show day. If you find errors in your catalogue entry these may be corrected on Show day.

CORRESPONDENCE

All correspondence must be accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope if a reply is required. Any complaints relating to the Show must be forwarded, in writing, to the Show Manager within seven days of the Show.

WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be made in writing. No withdrawals can be accepted after 9th May 2010. If your cat is ill and you enclose a veterinary certificate we may be able to refund some of your entry fees, at the discretion of the Show Committee, depending on when notification is received and how much work has already been done with regard to your entry.

PRE-SHOW PREPARATION

Read the rules carefully. A current vaccination means that the initial course or last booster must have been completed not less than one week and not more than one year plus one week before show day. "Homeopathic vaccination" is not acceptable. The vaccination certificate must be completed properly with the name and address of the owner and the full identity of the cat.

Please make sure that your exhibit is clean and healthy before arriving at the show. Please check your cat's claws and, if necessary, trim them before the show.

If you have to bath your cat please be very careful which shampoo you use. Many shampoos sold for cats contain colouring matter and if you use one of these your cat could be disqualified.

The use of any products, including skullcap & valerian, rescue remedy, sedatives for travel etc, which change a cat's appearance or physical reaction is forbidden and will lead to disqualification.

ARRIVAL AT THE SHOW

Exhibits will be received at the entrance to the Show Hall from 8 until 9.30 on the morning of the show. All exhibits must be brought to the show in suitable secure containers (top-opening recommended) and must be accompanied by their owners or representatives who must remain within call throughout the period of the Show except when the hall is cleared for judging. Exhibits will only be accepted on condition that the Clubs shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibits, containers or property in any way.

If your cat cannot be removed from the container safely it will not be vetted in. (see Rules)

All exhibits must be examined before entering the Show Hall. (see rules regarding rejection and Notes on Rejection at end of Section 4)

Any exhibit which, in the opinion of the Duty Veterinary Surgeon, is in poor condition or undersized for its age will be rejected. If the exhibit is below an acceptable size for a 14 week kitten it **MUST BE TAKEN HOME**. If necessary, in order to achieve this, all exhibits from that household will be excluded and all entry fees forfeited. If you are in any doubt about the size or condition of your exhibit, please leave it at home.

Rejected exhibits must be removed by their owners and entry fees forfeited. Owners of rejected exhibits, together with their other exhibits, may also be debarred from entering the Show Hall. The Duty Veterinary Surgeon's decision is final

OWNERS' LIABILITY FOR VETERINARY TREATMENT AT SHOWS

Exhibitors (owners) are responsible for the cost of any veterinary treatment required by their cat(s) in their absence from the show hall.

CLEARANCE

If your cat is rejected from a show please note the following points:

1. When sending your clearance certificate to the GCCF Office please include your copy of the rejection form.
2. Please do not send these certificates by special delivery post. If you wish to be sure they have arrived enclose a stamped addressed postcard to be signed and returned to you.

3. Exhibitors should not attend shows until they have received a letter from the Office accepting and confirming clearance. Take this letter with you to any shows you attend **within one month of its issue.**

PRESENTATION

Please read the Rules regarding pen equipment and penning your cat. Take pride in presenting your exhibit. Be sure that it is comfortable, warm and relaxed. White equipment will be on sale at the show. You may use the litter used at home - this need not be white. Sewn cat beds or "nests" are not allowed.

Exhibition pens are designed to form a display and may be decorated in any way you wish, but please make sure that there is ample room for the cat to be comfortable.

Vetting-in envelopes and exhibitors passes will be handed to you at vetting-in. Please check your pen number carefully and make sure you pen your cat correctly.

PLEASE NOTE

Please do not handle your cat or hover near your pen if a judge approaches to judge your cat. Indicating the ownership of the cat could lead to disqualification.

Nobody may remove an exhibit from its pen except the owner, owner's agent or Show official. Exhibitors must not carry their exhibits round the show hall. Exhibits must not be held in such a way as to annoy other exhibits. Any person in any way interfering with or removing any exhibit from its pen during the Show, except with the permission of the Show Manager, will forfeit any award that may be due.

Exhibits actually received into the Show Hall cannot be removed without the permission of the Show Manager. The Show closes at 5.00 pm and no exhibit may be removed from its pen before this time. Anyone breaking this rule could be subject to disciplinary action.

Judges are empowered to withhold any award in any class if the exhibits do not, in the Judge's opinion, possess sufficient merit.

WARNING

Exhibits, including those on exhibition, may not be sold at the show.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP

In order to qualify for the reduced Pedigree Show entry fee for Members you must be a fully paid-up Member of the BCS at the time of entry.

In order to qualify for the reduced Household Pet Show entry fee for Members you must be a fully paid-up Member of the BCS, TCC, RP&TPSCC, TPSCS or C&AF at the time of entry.

If you enter a Household Pet as a Member please indicate the Club of which you are a member.

THE COMMITTEE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO

1. Appoint other judges should those advertised be unable to fulfil their engagements and to appoint further judges should they be required.
2. Accept or refuse entries without giving reasons.
3. Cancel, amalgamate or divide classes.
4. Publish a catalogue of the Show containing information as to the exhibits and the names and addresses of exhibitors, and process such information by computer.
5. Retain a percentage of the entry fees to cover essential expenses in the event of the show being cancelled for any reason.

An announcement on the GCCF website of any alterations or additions made to the schedule or regulations shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.

SPONSORSHIP

A sponsorship form is included at the back of the schedule.

THE VENUE

Use the main car park entrance off Bagshot Road. Unless you are a stallholder we suggest you turn left and park as near the foyer entrance as possible.
(When you leave, the car park exit leads onto South Hill Road)

Enter the Leisure Centre via the main foyer entrance at the front of the building. Cross to the back of the café area and turn right down the corridor, past the changing rooms. The corridor turns left at the end: you will be facing the 3M Hall.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

ADULTS	9 months old and over on Show day. Born on or before 29.8.09
KITTENS	14 weeks – 9 months old on Show day. Born between 30.8.09 and 19.2.10
NEUTERED KITTENS	Should enter Open Kitten classes and suitable miscellaneous and club classes for kittens.
NEUTERS	Neutered adults, male or female, may only enter classes specified for neuters. Born on or before 29.8.09
BREEDERS	For exhibits bred by the exhibitor(s). Cats originally registered in the Breeders' joint ownership but changed to single ownership of one of the Breeders can still be entered in this class. Cats originally registered in the Breeder's single ownership and changed to joint ownership with the Breeder should be entered in the Non-Breeders class.
NOVICE	Exhibit that has not won a 1st prize in any class at a GCCF Show.
MAIDEN	Exhibit that has not won a 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize in any class at a GCCF Show.
LIMIT	Exhibit that has not won more than four 1st prizes in any class at a GCCF Show.
DEBUTANTE	Exhibit that has not been shown before under GCCF Rules.
ADOLESCENT	9 – 15 months old on Show day. Born between 28.2.09 and 29.8.09
JUNIOR	9 months – 2 years old on Show day. Born between 30.5.08 and 29.8.09
SENIOR	2 years old and over on Show day. Born on or before 29.5.08
VETERAN	7 years old and over on Show day. Born on or before 29.5.03

The status of the exhibit for entering restricted classes (Novice etc.) shall be its status on the day of entry, except where rules 11a and 11b, section 4 of the GCCF Rules apply. Wins as kittens do not count when entering adult classes. Wins as entire adults or kittens do not count when entering neuter classes. Merits do not count as first prizes when entering restricted classes (Novice etc.)

GRAND & IMPERIAL GRAND CLASSES

GCCF Champions/Premiers may enter their Grand Class and/or their Open Class.
GCCF Grand Champions/Premiers may enter any one or two of the three classes – Imperial Grand, Grand, Open.
Make certain that you have claimed your cat's title with the GCCF Office.

COUNTERSIGNATURES

Please read the Rule about Countersignatures thoroughly. If your cat may need a Countersignature you must tell the Show Manager before judging starts.

ENTRY FEES

Entry fees include open class and up to 3 other classes.

One free admission ticket per ownership, additional tickets £2 (£1 child/OAP).

NB: The Loyalty classes are free.

NO ENTRY CAN BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT THE APPROPRIATE ENTRY FEES

HOUSEHOLD PET SECTION

Members of the BCS, RP&TPSCC, TPSCS, TCC or C&AF may enter at Members rate

Non-Pedigree exhibits may be entered in both the BCS and TCC Shows

If entered in both shows, each exhibit may ONLY be entered in a maximum of FOUR classes per show

Non-Pedigree pets are unregistered cats from unregistered or unknown parents, of traditional "moggie" appearance. Pedigree pets are cats of known full or half pedigree background, registered or unregistered, or cats of pedigree appearance but of unknown background. They must be entered under their pet name, without prefixes, pedigree titles, or breed numbers. Both non pedigree and pedigree pets compete for certificates which will ultimately lead to the titles of Master Cat, Grand Master Cat and Imperial Grand Master Cat. Both are judged according to the normal household pet criteria only: presentation, condition, temperament and personality

All cats in the Household Pet section **aged 6 months or over** must be neutered.

Master Cat title

The title Master Cat shall be attained by the awarding of three Master Cat certificates by three different judges at participating championship or sanction shows licensed by the GCCF. Certificates awarded in the Coventry & Leicester Cat Club's Scheme count towards the title.

Grand Master Cat title

The title Grand Master Cat shall be attained by the awarding of three Grand Master Cat certificates by three different judges at participating championship or sanction shows licensed by the GCCF. To be eligible for the class, a cat must have achieved the Master Cat title before the published closing date of the show. Cats which have acquired the Master Cat title through the Coventry & Leicester Cat Club's Scheme are eligible.

Imperial Grand Master Cat title

The title Imperial Grand Master Cat shall be attained by the awarding of five Imperial Grand Master Cat certificates by five different judges at participating championship or sanction shows licensed by the GCCF. To be eligible for the class, a cat must have achieved the Grand Master Cat title before the published closing date of the show.

The coat is long, fine and silky and flows mainly flat along the body due to the absence of undercoat. The bone structure, coat colour and pattern is that retained from its Siamese breeding, which is strong, as Pedigrees may only contain Balinese, Siamese and the intermediate generation, referred to as the Balinese Variant. It follows naturally that no Balinese conforming to the above definition can have less than three generations of acceptable breeding in its immediate background.

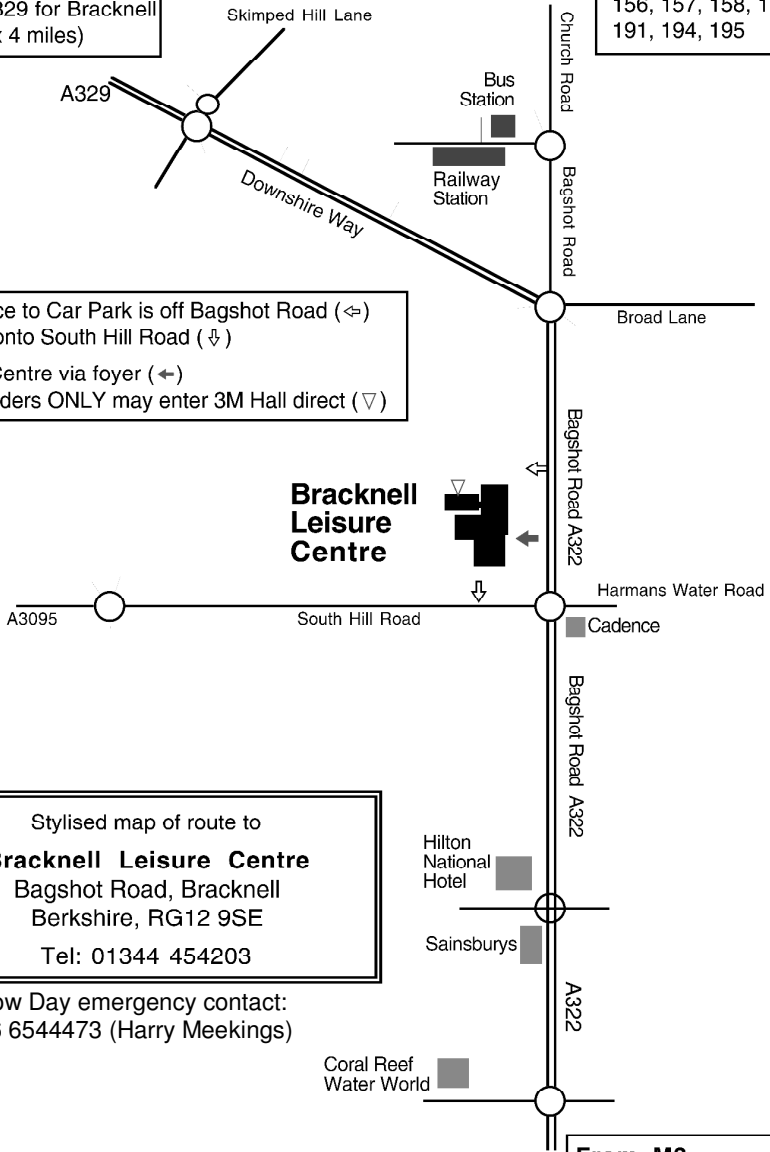
